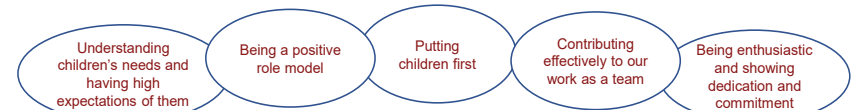

Commitment from Parents/Carers

By choosing Becontree Primary School, you are making a commitment to our aims and agreeing to the statements in our home-school agreement. A copy of the Home-School Agreement will be provided for you to sign when your child joins the school.

Safety

Your child's safety is our main priority

To ensure children's safety, the site boundary is locked during school hours.

All visitors to the site must sign in at the school office.

What you can do to help to keep your child safe

- **Tell us about any medication** your child requires. A medication form is available from the school office.
- **Tell us** if someone else will be collecting your child from school. Share a home collection code with us.
- **Inform us immediately** if your contact details change.
- **Dress your child** appropriately for the weather, in our full school uniform.
- **Ensure that your child wears** comfortable, suitable footwear for playing in the outdoor area, and when doing PE.
- **No jewellery** should be worn. If a bangle is worn for religious reasons, please speak to a member of staff for advice.
- **On hot days**, children may wear a sun hat or cap.
- **Every child should have** their own labelled water-bottle.

Promoting Positive Behaviour through Relational Practice

At Becontree Primary School, we believe that ALL children have learning, well-being and safeguarding needs; these principles underpin our exemplary inclusive practices throughout the school.



Children at Becontree engage positively with their learning and with one another, because all staff have high expectations of them and have developed encouraging respectful relationships with them. We endeavour to develop meaningful and consistent relationships with every individual, group, and family.

Developing a growth mindset and positive behaviours for learning are actively taught and promoted. We do this through the 5Rs. These allow children to be Respectful, Ready to learn, Reflective, Responsible and Resilient.

Recognition Boards

We strongly believe in explicitly teaching relationships and learning behaviours we want to see and celebrating our successes as a class; this is done through class recognition boards. Each class has a target that they are working on. Targets are taken from our Behaviour and Learning Expectations or link directly to our school vision and values.

- At the start of each week, the class recognition board is blank, and the teacher and children agree a target. This is written on the board, e.g., I listen to others when they talk, and I take turns to speak.
- When a child meets the target, their name or photo is added to the board.
- The aim is to get everyone's name/photo on the board by the end of the week. Children and adults support ALL children to achieve this!

School Uniform

Wearing school uniform helps children feel part of our school community and creates a sense of belonging.

Clothing

- **Light-blue collared shirt** (long or short sleeved)
- **Grey trousers or shorts**
- **grey skirts or pinafore dresses**
- **Blue checked summer dress** may be worn in warmer weather
- **Maroon V-neck sweatshirt or cardigan** with the school logo

Footwear

- **Plain black shoes or trainers** (no coloured flashes)
- **Plain white, grey or black socks or tights**

Accessories

- **School tie** (optional)
- **Maroon head coverings**, if worn for religious reasons
- **Children with long hair** must tie it up using **simple hair accessories in our school colours**.



School Bag:

Every child should bring a suitable school bag each day. Official Becontree school bags are available to purchase from Khalsa Schoolwear. Where possible, please avoid sending children with very large bags as storage space is limited.



PE

Children are expected to participate in all PE lessons and should wear a PE kit to school on the days they have PE. Your child's teacher will let you know which days your child will have PE.

Our PE kit :

- **White T-shirt and black shorts**
- **Black tracksuit** for colder weather
- **Black plimsolls or trainers** for outside activities
- **No earrings**



Label all clothing with your child's name.

In Year 4, children will need a swimming kit, including:

- **Swimming cap**
- **Towel**
- **Goggles** (optional)

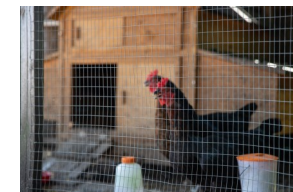

Attendance Matters

Although parents/carers have the legal responsibility for ensuring their child's good attendance, the Headteacher and Governors at our school work together with other professionals and agencies to ensure that all pupils are encouraged and supported to develop good attendance habits. The procedures below are followed to ensure that this happens.

School Attendance

Our attendance target is 97%



Stage	Attendance	What happens

Reward for Good Attendance

To encourage regular attendance, we are running a BECONTREE 100 competition in which classes can earn a non-uniform day for regular attendance for 12 days.

Each day with a 100% attendance means a class will earn a letter/number. When they have all 12, they earn a non-uniform day for their class.

Curriculum

All children in key stage 2 follow the National Curriculum, which offers a broad and balanced range of learning experiences.



Literacy

Children's spoken language, reading, writing and vocabulary is developed as integral aspects of the teaching of every subject, and English as a subject in its own right. Children are taught to speak clearly and convey ideas confidently using standard English. Children are taught to read fluently for understanding and pleasure. Stamina and skills to write at length, with accurate spelling, punctuation and grammar is also developed.

Mathematics

In key stage 2 we have adopted the Ark Maths Mastery to deliver our maths curriculum in order to deliver the aims of the National Curriculum. Children are encouraged to explore new concepts with their partner and explain their thinking using full sentences and mathematical vocabulary. Children will develop their number sense, understanding of shapes, measures and data.

Personal, Social and Health Education

Children are provided with experiences and support to help them develop a positive sense of themselves and others, to form positive relationships and develop respect for others. Children are encouraged to develop social skills, learn how to manage their feelings, to understand appropriate behaviour in groups and to have confidence in their own abilities. Refer to the school's website for more information regarding our Relationship and Health Education policy.

Religious Education

Religion and beliefs inform our values and are reflected in what we say and how we behave. RE is an important subject in itself, developing an individual's knowledge and understanding of the religions and beliefs which form part of our society. RE also contributes to children's personal development and well-being and to community cohesion by promoting mutual respect and tolerance in a diverse society.



Key Stage 2 School Day

8.45 Children enter through the year 3/4 doors and are registered.

8.50—10.45 a.m. Morning lessons take place.

10.45 a.m.—11:00 a.m. Playtime.

11.00—12.15 Morning Lessons take place.

12.15 p.m.—1.15 p.m. Key stage 2 Lunchtime. (Except Year 4 on Tuesdays 12.00pm - 1.00 pm due to swimming lessons)

1.15 p.m.—3.15 p.m. Afternoon lessons take place.

3.15 p.m. Parents collect children from the doors adjacent to the classrooms.

School Dinners

Becontree Primary School is proud to be a healthy school. We offer a range of healthy options for children at lunchtime. Please refer to the website for the full menu.



London's Mayor and City Hall are ensuring all primary school children who attend state schools in London will receive free school meals for the full academic year. Therefore, every child at Becontree Primary School (Reception to Year 6) will be entitled to a free school meal every day.

Please book lunches at home using School Grid before children come to school. This is very helpful to avoid wasting learning time in school and because many children are often unsure if they like the options available. Thank you.

If your child has any special dietary requirements or is allergic to any foods please also speak to a member of office staff.

Packed Lunches

You may decide that you would like to provide your child with a packed lunch each day. Please make sure:

- You use a plastic box/ lunch container
- Your child's name and class are clearly marked on the outside
- Drinks are in cartons/ plastic bottles. Your child's packed lunch contains healthy foods.
- The lunch must be nut-free.



Home Learning

Assessment

Children are tested formally in maths and reading at key points each term. This result, as well as ongoing teacher assessment, will inform the end of year levels allocated. Teacher assessment is also used to judge attainment in other subject areas. At the end of year 4, children will take a national times tables test called the Multiplication Tables Check (MTC). At the end of year 6, children will take a National assessment in mathematics, reading and spelling, punctuation and grammar (SPAG) in May. A judgement on their capability in writing, and other subjects will also be carried out by class teachers. Parents are informed about children's attainment and progress at the end of the Autumn and the Summer term.

Parent Workshops and Meetings

We run a range of workshops and meetings for parents throughout the school year. This is a good opportunity for you to find out about how you can best support your child at home with their reading, writing and maths.

Parent/Teacher Consultation

We hold Parent Teacher Meetings twice a year, where you will get to discuss your child's progress with their class teacher. It is very important that you attend these meetings. If you are not available, an alternative time can be arranged.

Throughout the year, parents can arrange to meet with class teachers at any time to discuss any concerns they might have. Staff are also available in the playground at the start and end of every day.



Other Areas of the Curriculum

Other areas covered within the curriculum are science, design technology, history, geography, P.E., art, computing, music and French. Our website provides further information about the areas covered in year 3 to 6.



Trips and Enrichment

Children will experience a variety of trips and activities to enrich their learning journey. We believe it is important to place children's learning in context and allow them to develop their skills for life, in the wider community, such as visits to a variety of different religious buildings and places of interest such as museums, parks and historical sites.

Support for Children with Additional Needs

We believe that every child should be supported to fulfil their potential in their academic, emotional, social and physical development. We promote inclusive practice across the curriculum for all children with special educational needs by using Learning Support Assistants where appropriate, and differentiating lessons.

We also provide intensive support for pupils with a higher level of need than others. This may include withdrawal for more focused work on the basic skills of literacy and numeracy, speech and communication and other areas of need.

Miss Reilly, supported by the Deputy Head Teachers in EYFS/KS1 and KS2, leads on SEND in school.
