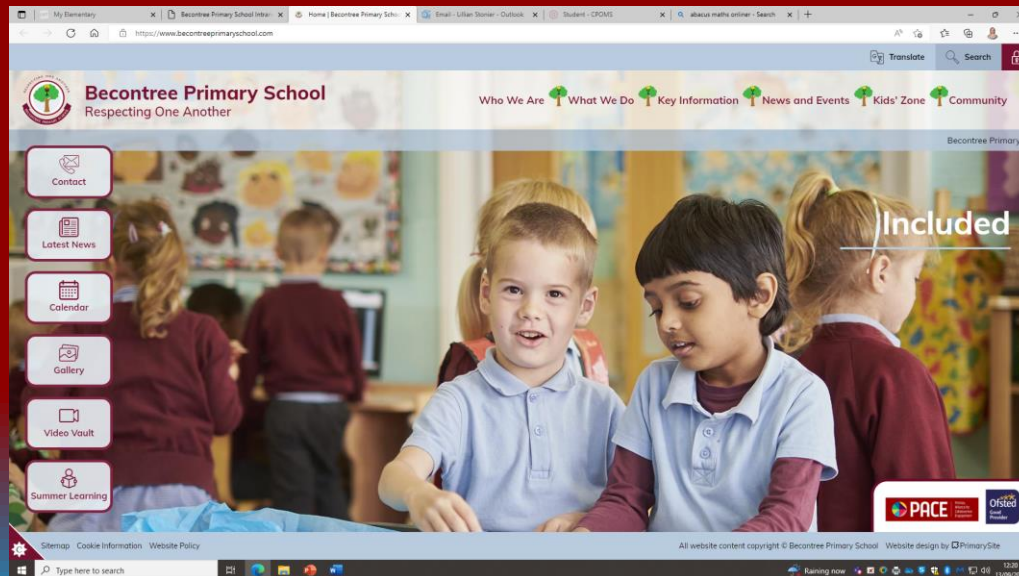


Home School Communication

This information, as well as information about planning and schemes of work used in school can be found on our school website.

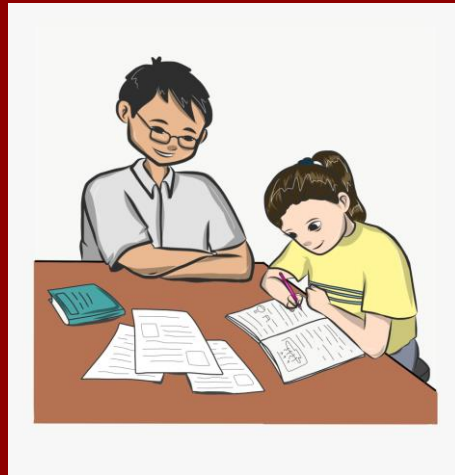

Any activity that children undertake outside of school lesson time, either on their own or with the support of family members.

At Becontree Primary School, we promote home learning and encourage parents/carers to be involved in children's learning. The following slides explain how we approach home learning.

Home Learning Expectations

Talking with children about learning in school

Parent/Carers should have frequent **conversations** with children to support their language and speaking skills.

Further information about developing language and communication can be found in home-learning booklets on the website.

Also check out our top tips to improve language and communication shared in the monthly Newsletter.



Reading

Children should be **reading** for at least **10 minutes daily**.

The home-reading book should be at an appropriate level for the child's reading stage and should be changed regularly.

Reading may be independent – especially as children get older – but it is good if an adult can hear a child read.

Your child will also bring a library book home which is their 'own choice' of book.

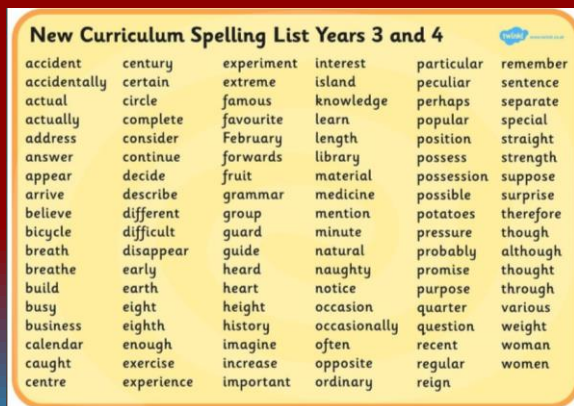
Spelling Practice

A copy of the year group spelling list will be shared by class teachers at the start of every term. They can also be found in the Home Learning Booklets on the school website.

Children need to be practising these at home.

Children are tested on these at the end of every term and progress is rewarded with certificates.

Accessing Online Platforms

Nursery and Reception

In Nursery and Reception, home learning ideas are shared with parents via the Class Dojo app.



Numbots is an early maths online platform which can be accessed via the school website as an optional home learning tool.



The ANTON app is another optional, free home learning app. The app covers all subjects taught, e.g. history, geography, music, maths etc. To use the app, you need to simply download it from either the App store or Google Play.



Accessing Online Platforms

Year 1 and 2

Spelling Shed is a spelling online platform linked to our scheme used in school. We recommend that children play at least 3 games per week.



Numbots is an early maths online platform which can be accessed via the school website as an optional home learning tool.



Times Tables Rockstars is an online platform to practise times and division tables. This will be recommended to year 2 children when they start learning their tables.

Year 3 to 4

Spelling Shed is a spelling online platform linked to our scheme used in school. We recommend that children play at least 3 games per week.

Story Zoo (Year 3 Only)

Children could either do their 10 minutes daily reading online OR using class or home reading books – all can be recorded on StoryZoo.

Times Tables Rockstars is an online platform to practise times and division tables. We recommend that this be accessed 3 times per week for 10 minutes at a time.



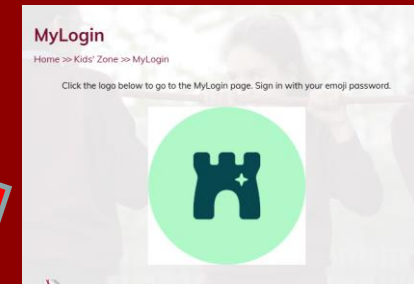
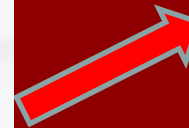
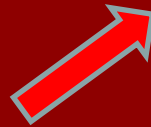

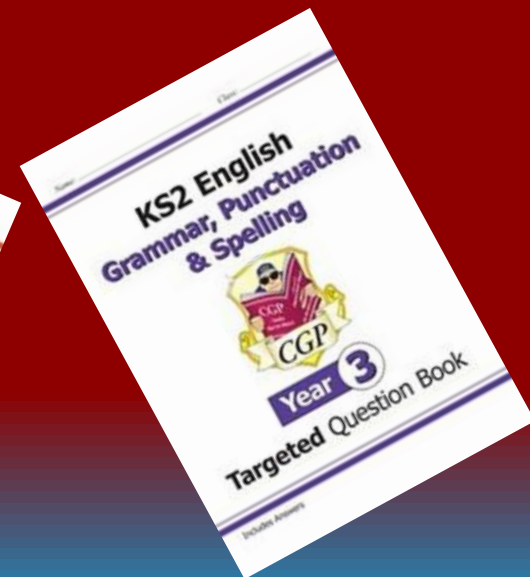
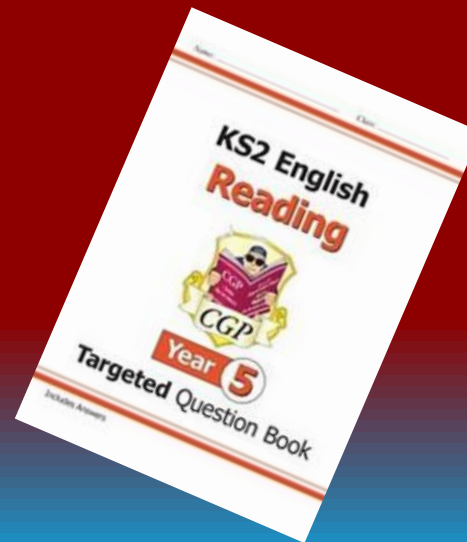
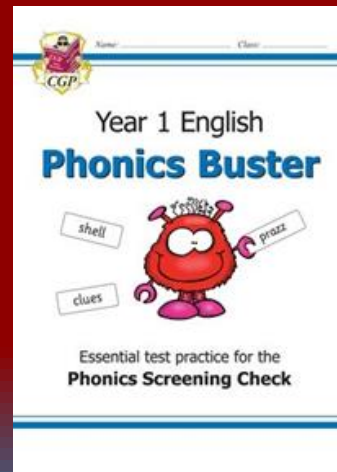
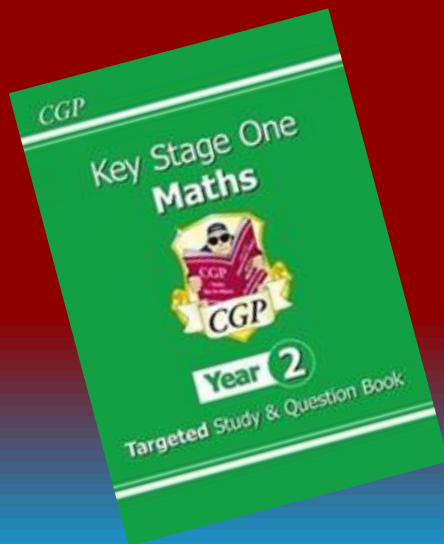


Home Learning Activity Books (CGP)

These books are an optional resource that may be used linked to topics taught in class. All overviews of planning are provided on the school website.

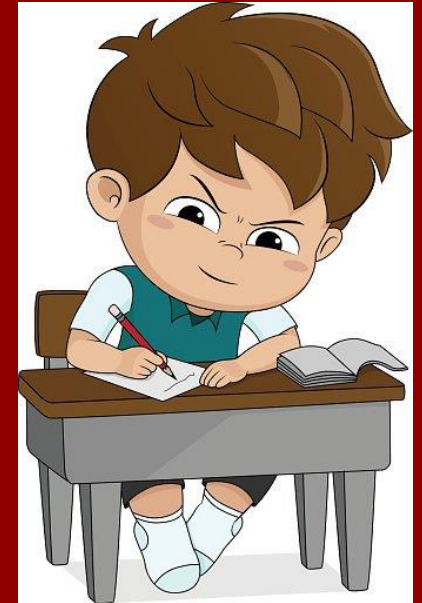

Year 6 Home Learning

In addition to home learning suggested above, as part of their preparation for SATs, year 6 children will have weekly paper-based home learning tasks assigned in reading, grammar and maths.

Every child will have a home learning folder and be expected to complete all set tasks and return their folders on the allocated day.



Half term Home Learning Ideas

This will set out a suggestion of optional activities which could be completed at home linked to topics covered in class.

Children could share completed tasks with class teachers.

Bring it in to show, or email the office to forward it to the class teachers.



Family Projects

We will be assigning optional projects over half terms and holidays linked to shared events in school.
