'Vera for Victory'

Dame Vera Lynn, DBE (born Vera Margaret Welch on 20 March 1917), is widely known as *The Forces' Sweetheart*. As an English singer, songwriter and actress, Vera's musical recordings and performances were enormously popular during the Second World War. *We'll Meet Again*, *The White Cliffs of Dover*, *A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square* and *There'll Always Be an England* are amongst her many popular songs. She held outdoor concerts for the troops and helped to keep the nation's spirits high during our darkest days at war. She has remained ever popular after the war, appearing on radio and television in the UK and the United States. Devoting much time and energy to charity work connected with ex-servicemen, disabled children and breast cancer. She is still held in great affection by veterans of the Second World War and in 2000 was named the Briton who best exemplified the spirit of the twentieth century. At the age of 98 she still continues with her fund raising and it is with great honour that she has signed just 70 copies of this limited edition print to commemorate the 70 year anniversaries of VE day and VJ day.
