A Life Cycle Of The Longneck- Widemouth.

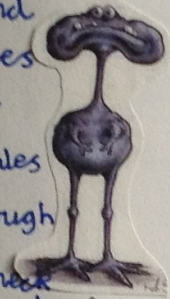

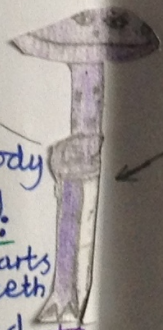
